

4.4 Grading scheme and, if available, grade distribution guidance:

Students receive grades according to the national and ECTS (European Credit Transfer System) grading systems. Minimum mark required to validate a module = E on the European system of grading. There is no compensation system. Each student has to pass each exam and obtain all the 120 ECTS to be graduated.

ECTS grades are reported on a carefully calibrated and uniform A–F scale combined with keywords and short qualitative definitions. **The ECTS grade is not meant to replace the local grades of the Partner Universities**, but to be used additionally in order to "translate" and "transcript" a grade from one institution to another.
